

A globally accepted standard

TALQ is a worldwide Consortium initiated by companies from the lighting industry. TALQ aims for a globally accepted management software interface for outdoor lighting networks to create interoperability across available solutions.


The TALQ Consortium has identified that this absence of a standard interface for outdoor lighting networks is a key reason why outdoor lighting operators are currently hesitant in deploying such systems.

The mission of TALQ Consortium: Interoperability of Outdoor Lighting Networks

Solutions for outdoor lighting control are already in place in many countries. They normally consist of a Central Management System (CMS) and an Outdoor Lighting Network (OLN) of connected light points. The lack of a standardized communication between CMS and OLN leads to the situation that an outdoor lighting operator either has to rely on a single source, or has to utilize different systems that are non-interoperable, and therefore very complex to integrate, operate and maintain.

The TALQ Consortium will standardize the interface between CMS and OLN thus, enabling vendor independent interoperability through the connection of a single TALQ compliant CMS to any TALQ compliant OLN.

By establishing this globally accepted standard, the Consortium is convinced that it can provide more choice and give greater accessibility for remote monitoring and control in outdoor lighting.
